Julius Caesar

Characters

Julius Caesar – a great Roman general and senator, recently returned to Rome in triumph after a successful military campaign

Senators

Cicero – renowned for his oratorical skill; he speaks at Caesar's triumphal parade

Publius – Metellus Cimber's brother who is banished from Rome

Popilius Lena – holds a minor role as Senator in the play

Conspirators against Julius Caesar

Marcus Brutus – a supporter of the republic who believes strongly in a government guided by the votes of senators. He loves Caesar as a friend but strongly opposes the ascension of any single man to the position of dictator. He fears Caesar aspires to such power

Cassius – a talented general and longtime acquaintance of Caesar; he dislikes the fact that Caesar has become godlike in the eyes of Romans

Casca – a public figure opposed to Caesar's rise to power

Trebonius – he attends the meeting at Brutus' house; he tries to distract Caesar from reading Artemidorus' letter/petition

Ligarius – he spoke well of Pompey and was mistreated by Caesar for doing so

Decius Brutus – he convinces Caesar that Calpurnia (Caesar's wife) has misinterpreted her dire nightmares **Metellus Cimber** – he begs Caesar to repeal his brother's banishment from Rome

Cinna – he leaves one of the anonymous letters for Brutus; he is one of the more enthusiastic conspirators

Flavius and Marullus – tribunes of the people (a tribune is an officer of ancient Rome elected by the Plebeians to protect their rights)

Artemidorus of Cnidos – Learns of the conspiracy but is unsuccessful in warning Caesar **Soothsayer** – one who foretells events, a seer

Friends to Brutus and Cassius

Lucilius – an officer in Brutus' army

Titinius – an officer in Cassius' army

Messala – messenger in Brutus' army

Young Cato – a soldier in Brutus' army and Portia's brother

Volumnius – an officer in Brutus' army; they are old school friends

Servants to Brutus

Varro, Clitus, Claudius, Strato, Lucius, and Dardanius

Servant to Cassius

Pindarus

Calupurnia – wife of Caesar; believes deeply in omens

Portia – wife of Brutus

The Ghost of Caesar

Cinna – a poet (he has the unfortunate distinction of sharing a name with Cinna the conspirator)

Triumvirs after the Death of Caesar (a triumvir is one of the three men sharing civil authority in ancient Rome)

Octavius Caesar – Caesar's adopted son and appointed successor

Marcus Antonious (Antony) – a friend of Caesar

M. Aemilius Lepidus – the third member of Octavius and Antony's coalition
