- 7. decadence (n.) decay, depravity, corruption
- 8. discrete (adj.) separate and distinct; unconnected (not "discreet": this is a different word)
- 9. effeminate (adj.) having womanly or female traits
- 10. filial (adj.) pertaining to a son or daughter; the relationship between a child and parent
- 11. gambol (v.) a playful skipping or frolicking about
- 12. glutinous (adj.) resembling glue in texture; sticky (not "gluttonous": this is a different word)
- 13. iconoclastic (adj.) attacking cherished traditions or beliefs
- 14. import (n.) importance; significance
- 15. inveigle (v.) to win over by coaxing, flatter or artful talk
- 16. largess (n.) a generous gift or offer
- 17. lurid (adj.) causing shock or horror; gruesome; marked by sensationalism
- 18. misnomer (n.) a wrong name or label; incorrect designation
- 19. ordain (v.) to command, arrange or consecrate
- 20. paraphernalia (n.) equipment; odds and ends

- 21. pedestrian (adj.) ordinary, unimaginative
- 22. prate (v.) to speak foolishly; to boast idly
- 23. querulous (adj.) fretful; whining
- 24. redress (n.) a remedy; a compensation
- 25. rife (adj.) abundant; current (often used with "with)
